At the Request of Thomas Nixon of the County of Chester That we would grant him to take up Two hundred Acres of Land on Doe Run near Brandywine, for which he agrees to pay to the Proprietors use Twenty pounds within three Months after the date hereof and one shilling sterling for each hundred for a Yearly Quittrent for ever: These are to Authorize and Require thee to survey or cause to be survey'd to the said Thomas Nixon according to the method of Townships appointed the said quantity of Two hundred Acres of Vacant Land on the said Run and make a Return thereof into the Secretaries Office Which Survey in case

the said Thomas fulfill the Agreemt aforesaid Shall be valid, otherwise to be void and of no Effect as if it had never been made nor this Warrt ever Granted.
