grant him to take up five hundred acres of Land in y<sup>e</sup> County of Chester,  
in part thereof. These are therefore in the Proprietary's Name to will & require  
thee forthwith to survey or cause to be survey'd unto him the said Number  
of Acres, in the aforesaid County, where not already taken up, according to  
y<sup>e</sup> Method of Townships appointed by y<sup>e</sup> Govern'r for seating and improving the  
same w<sup>th</sup>in Six Months from y<sup>e</sup> date of Survey, and make returns thereof  
into y<sup>e</sup> Govern'r's Secretary's office. Given at Philadelphia y<sup>e</sup> 8<sup>th</sup> 10<sup>th</sup> M<sup>o</sup> 1684.
