

Whereas Timothy Clement had formerly a grant ffor 30ffoot
of Bank at ye south end of Philadelphia which was accord-
ingly laid out with the usual length would not reach ye River Delaware
and therefore ye Regulation of ye bank as in other parts of
Philadelphia could not be performed which aforesaid Lott after
improvements made thereon by y^e said Clement was sold by him
to Patrick Robinson who hath requested ~~us~~ us to grant ye
said Lott to him in his owne name together with a convenient
number of ffloor at ye east end thereof yt ye same may be
accommodated with ye River Delaware as ye bank doth in
other parts of ye Towne wh^{ch} wee have granted the same to
be laid out as followeth, viz; at 150 ffoot distance eastward
of y^e ffront Part ^{1^e} thereto runn a street of 30 ffoot broad
the next layout 45 ffoot for building thereon then next thereto
a street of 30 ffoot broad then extend into ye River 175 ffoot.

These are to will and require thee to execute ye same and
likewise unto Jer Elfreth and Peter Sherbom each twenty-nine
foot and a halfe in breadth between ye afore said 30 ffoot street
and ffront streed of all which make returns ~~thee~~ to ye
Secretary's office.
