At the request of Randal Vernon. That I would grant him to take up three hundred and fifteen acres, together with ten acres of Liberty land in full of his Original Purchase of 625 acres. These are to require thre forthwith to survey or cause to be survey'd unto him according to the method of Townships by me appointed the sd number of three hundred and fifteen acres of land in this Province that has not been already survey'd nor taken up, nor is concealed, nor seated by the Indians w^{ch} survey being duly made and returned shall, if seated within twelve months after date thereof be confirmed to him his heirs and assigns forever. Also to survey or cause to be survey'd to the said ~~Randal~~ Randal Vernon the sd number of ten acres of land in the Liberties of Philadelphia and make distinct returns of both the sd surveys into my Secretaries office. Given under my hand & seal at Philad^{ia} the 21st of ye first month 1700/1.
