At the request of Rich^d Vickris, That I would grant him to take up five Hundred acres of land in right of an old Purchase by him made in England of two thousand acres, These are to require thee forthwith to survey or cause to be surveyed unto him the said number of acres of land in this Province where it is not already taken up, to be laid out according to ye Method of Townships by me appointed. And make returns thereof into my Secretaries office. Given under my hand and seal this 18th day of the 12th mo.th A. D. 1700.
