


Pennsylvania 55.



By the Proprietaries.

Upon the Application and request of Thomas Bishop Vickris by his Attorney Richard Mackly of the City of Philadelphia Merch<sup>t</sup>. That we would be pleased to grant him a survey on four hundred and ninety two acres of land among the late surveys made within our Province and also eight acres the proportion of Liberty land thereunto belonging within the Liberties of Philad<sup>e</sup> being the original Purchase of five hundred acres made of our late deceased Father William Penn Esq<sup>r</sup> by Roger Drew under wher<sup>e</sup>e the sd Thomas Bishop Vickris claims title to the same.

These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be surveyed unto the said Thomas Bishop Vickris according to the method of township appointed the said Quantity of four hundred ninety two acres and also the aforesd eight acres of Liberty land where the same may be found Vacant within the Liberties of Philad<sup>e</sup> and make return thereof into our Secretarys office in order for Confirmation. Given under my hand and the seal of our land office at Philad<sup>e</sup> this second day of December Anno Domini 1740.
