Upon the Application and request of Thomas Bishop Vickris by his Attorney Richard Hockley of the City of Philadelphia Mercht That we would be pleased to grant him a resurvey on a tract of land which was first laid out unto his father and Uncle Richard and Robert Vickris who are since deceased lying on the east side of Schuylkill River and on Wesselickon Creek in the County of Philad<sup>a</sup> and also to resurvey the proportion of Liberty Land to him belonging Situate within the Northern Liberties of Philadelphia the better to discover and fix the true lines and bounds of the same.

These are to authorize and require thee to resurvey or cause to be resurveyed unto the said Thomas Bishop Vickris According to the first lines and bounds thereof and of the adjoining lands the afores<sup>d</sup> tract and proportion of Liberty land and make return thereof into our Secretarys Office in Order for further Confirmation Given under my hand and the seal of our land office at Philad<sup>a</sup> this first day of December Anno. Dom 1790.
