



By virtue of a warrant from the Surveyor General of this Province to me directed dated _____ I have surveyed these two small tracts of land for Edward Farmer and William Lowther in right and being part of 1000 acres of land which was formerly granted to Silas Grispan by patent but when the Lot Resurvey was found to be in the lines of the German Company's land upon which there was a warrant granted for laying out other land in behalf of the same therefore I have laid out these two tracts in right of part of the same the first beginning at a small hickry in the old line of Bushkirk's land then south east by William Thomas land one hundred and fifty six peachches to another hickry then north east one hundred and eight peachches to a post by John Umfreys land then north ~~west~~ west one hundred and fifty six peachches to a post then south west one hundred and eight peachches to the place of beginning containing one hundred and six acres of land ~~the~~ the other tract Beginning at a marked hickry at a ^{the land} corner of ~~s.e.~~ Evin Thomas ~~stationed~~ then south east one hundred peachches to a post then north east one hundred and sixty nine peachches by William James land then northwest one hundred peachches to a heap of stones ~~by marked tree~~ then by the said old line southwest one hundred and sixty nine peachches to the place of beginning containing one hundred acres of ~~land~~ land Surveyed on the 18th of the 12 month 1729.
