By Virtue of a Writt of Subpoena to thee directed and herewith shewn thee  
Thou art personally to be and appear before his Majestys Justices of the Supream  
Court of Pensilvania on Monday the Eleventh day of April next at nine of the clock in the  
forenoon of the same day at the Supream Court then to be holden at Philadelphia in  
and for the sd Province bringing with thee then and there the warrants of survey &  
resurvey heretofore granted to Lawrence Grondon and Joseph Grondon for surveying  
and resurveying of lands to them in the county of Bucks also a caveat entred by  
the sd Joseph Grondon touching the Premises together with the returns of survey  
made to those warrants & now remaining in my office, and also then & there to  
Declare & Testify the Truth according to thy Knowledge in a certain cause now  
depending and then and there to be tryed between Lawrence Grondon Plaintiff and  
Joseph Grondon and Hannah Grondon Defendants in a Plea of Partition on the part  
of the Plaintiff and thereof thou art not to fail on Pain and Peril that may fall there  
on Dated the Twenty third day of March in the tenth year of ye reign of our Sovereign  
Lord George the Second of Great Brittain France and Ireland King &c Anno<sup>e</sup> Dom 1736.
