At ye Request of Jacob Telner Purchaser of ~~five~~<sup>thousand</sup> acres of land that wee would grant him to take up ye Remaining part untaken up wch is two thousand nine hundred ninety & ffive in ord<sup>r</sup> To make a townshipp in ye Courty of Philadelphia.

These are therefore in ye Proprietarys name to will & require thee forthwith to survey or cause to be survey'd unto him ye said number of acres in ye aforesaid Courty where not already taken up according to ye method of townshipp appointed by ye Gover<sup>r</sup> the seating and improveing the same within six months after ye date of survey and make returne hereof to ye Secretarys office. Dated at Philadelphia ye 6<sup>th</sup> 9<sup>mo</sup> 1685.
