 to each of them accordingly.

These are therefore in the Proprietors name to will and require thee forthwith to
 survey or cause to be surveyed to Edward Farmer three thousand seven hundred
 and ffiftie acres thereof, and to Kathrin (late Farmer now) Billapp Relict and executrix
 of the said Jasper Farmer twelve hundred and fiftie acres of the said land, in
 such forme and method as they their guardians and attorneyes shall agree and make
 distinct returne hereof to the Secretaries office, dated att Philadelphia the seventh
 day of the twelfth mo. February 1689.
