In pursuance of a concession this day made thee by us for five hundred acres of land on acco<sup>t</sup> of a Debt remaining due to thee on thy Salary for executing the office of Supervisor of the Surveyor Generals office from the year 1702 to 1707. These are to authorize thee to direct any of ye Deputy Surveyors for the Counties of this Province to survey and lay out to thy proper use the said quantity of Five hundred acres of land that has not been already survey'd nor taken up nor is seated by the Indians, And make returns thereof into the secretaries office. Given under our hands and seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 8<sup>th</sup> day of October A.D. 1713.
