



Whereas upon a resurvey of ye land of Shakamackson there was found severall acres of land overplus, w^{ch} we have upon good Consideration disposed off to Robt Turner as also ye meddled(c-61) that proportionably therunto belongs with all the Cripple and swamp from Jo^e Boyers northward Lyne to ye northward most line of ye land of Shakamackse w^{ch} contained it wth ye overplus.

These are therefore in the Proprietarys name to will and require thee forthwith to survey or cause to be surveyed unto him ye said overplus with its midden swamp and Cripple as above express ed to ye likeing and approbation of ye said Robt Turner and in such manner as they may be appertainances to his land he now lives on, and all to be contained in one returne, and make returne thereoff to ye Secret-
arys office. Dated at Philad the 12th day of ye 11 mo 1690.
