

By virtue of a warrant from Edward Pennington Surveyor General being dated the 10<sup>th</sup> of this instant directed unto me I hereby certify into his office that I have surveyed and laid out unto Richard Vickris a certaine pece of land in the city Liberty begining at a marked maple in a smale brarish neere Germantowne line from thence west south west one hundred and fifty <sup>four</sup> perches to a stak sett in ye ground from thence north north west thirty one perch to anoth stak in the line of Benjamin Morgans land from thence east north east by a line of mared trees one hundred and seventy six perches to post in the Germantowne line frobl) thence south 10 degrees west by a the said brarich thirty ~~6~~<sup>8</sup> perches to the place of begining Containing and laid out for thirty and two acres of land the 14<sup>th</sup> 6 mo 1700.
