William Penn Proprietary and Governoour of the Province of Pensilvania
and Counties Annexed.

At the request of Richard Tucker. That I would grant him to take up Five Hundred acres of land in right of his Wife's Purchase of 250 acres, and in Consideration of other land by him returned to me. These are to require thos forthwith to survey or cause to be surveyed unto him the said number of Acres, in some convenient place in the County of Philadelphia (or ye adjacent as he shall chuse) not already taken up. to be laid out according to the Method of townships by me appointed, and make returne thereof to my Secretaries office. Given under my hand and seal at Philadelphia the 28th day of the 3^d month 1700.
