Territories thereunto belonging.

At ye request of Robert Turner yt I would grant him to take up two hundred acres
of land in part of his Purchase, in ye county of Philadelphia. These are to will &
require thee forthwth to survey or cause to be surveyd unto him ye sd number of acres
in ye aforementioned County, where not already taken up, according to ye method
of Townships appointed by me, & make returns thereof into my Secretary's office.

Given at Philadelphia, ye 20th of ye 1st mo. 1683 $\frac{1}{4}$
