Skoolkill and having sett up a saw mill and intending to build  
 other mills on ye east side of ye sd Creek wh<sup>ch</sup> will be of great  
 service to ye publick and in order to carry on and Incourage him in  
 his designs, at his request wee have granted him Thirty two acres  
 of liberty land lying on ye eastward side of ye Skoolkill about ye  
 falls as convenient as possible for a landing to his aforesaid  
 Improvern<sup>ts</sup>

These are therefore in ye Proprietors name to will and require thos forthwith  
 to survey or cause to be surveyed unto him ye said land and make returne  
 thereoff to ye Secretarys office. Dated at Philad ye 6<sup>th</sup> day of ye 2<sup>d</sup> mo.  
 1689.
