

By vertue of a warrant from Edward Pennington Surveyor General bearing date the
7th of ye 8th mo. 1700. Directed unto me I hereby certify into his office that I
have surveyed and laid out the 6th of the 9th mo ensuing unto Samuel Taver-
ner a certaine tract of land in the township of Lumbriek in the county of Philadelphia beginn-
ing at a post by the street or roade runn-
ing through the said township
being a corner post deviating it from Richard Peere land from thence by the said
Peere line of marked trees north east five hundred perches to a post set in the
ground from thence north west by a line of marked trees one hundred and sixty
perches to another post sett in the ground from thence southwest by a line of
marked trees five hundred perches to ^a* post ~~is~~ by the said street or roade
from thence by ye same south east one hundred and sixty perches to the place
of beginning containing and laid out for five hundred acres of land.
