

By virtue of severall warrants from the surveyor Gen^l to me directed. Pursuant to the Proprietors warrants to him directed viz. the first the 17th of the 5th moth 1683, for one thousand acres of land, the second dated the 14th of the 12th moth 1683, for five thousand six hundred acres, the third dated the 16th of the 3rd moth 1684 for seven hundred & twenty acres, the fourth dated the said 16th of the 3rd moth 1684 ^{500^a}. The 2^d day of the 12th moth 1694. Then compleated the survey of the above said severall quantties of land within the county of Philadelphia being seven Thousand eight hundred and twenty acres of land. Beginning at a black oak tree marked for a corner standing in the line of William Harnans land and on the eastside of a small run of water thence north east by the same ~~and~~ and the land of Tryall Holmes seven hundred and eighty perches to a post thence north west by the lands of Joseph Fisher, W^t Stanley John West and John Day one thousand six hundred and four perches to a post for a corner. Thence south west by the land of James Peters seven hundred and eighty perches to another corner post. Thence southeast by the Towneship layed out for Richard Whitpaine, Charles Marshall, Thomas Cox, John Basley and others one thousand six hundred and (obl-) perches to the first mentionid place of begining containing ~~as~~ as aforesaid seven Thousand eight hundred and Twenty acres of land.
