

By virtue of a warrant from Edward Pennington Surveyor General bearing date  
 5<sup>th</sup> of 2<sup>d</sup> month 1709 directed unto me I do hereby certify into his office that  
 I have surveyed and laid out unto Joseph Tanner a certain tract of land  
 in the County of Philadelphia beginning at a corner stake deviding it from  
 Nathaniel Pugles land from thence north east by a line of marked trees 500  
 perches to a stake sett in the ground hard by a wtoke marked from thence by  
 a line of marked trees north west 96 perches to a post sett in the ground  
 deviding it from Joseph Pikes land from thence by a line of marked trees  
 south west 500 perches to another stake deviding it from the said Pikes land  
 from thence south east 196 perches to a line of marked trees to ye place of  
 begining containing and laid out for Three hundred acres of land ye  
 21<sup>st</sup> of ye 4<sup>th</sup> 1701.
