

By virtue of Warrants from the Commissioners impowered to grant Lots & lands in the Province of Pensilvania &c. dated the 6th of the 9th month 1685 there was surveyed & laid out unto Jacob Teltner &c. on the 12th of the 10th month 1685 a tract of land in the County of Philadelphia, which at ye request of Albertus Brandt in right of Jacob Teltner above mentioned on or about the year 1698 was subdivided & Albertus Brandt his part of the said Jacob Teltner's proportion of the said tract of land laid out distinctly by its self (as appear by a Certificate under ye hand of Thomas Fairman deposited in my office) in a regular form & method of Townships, viz. Beginning at a marked Hickory sapling thence northwest five hundred ninety five perches to a post for a corner, thence southwest four hundred & eighty perches to (obl)post near a black oak tree, thence southeast along the Township road (ob. b. 1-) hundred ninety five perches to a corner marked white oak tree, thence northeast four hundred & eighty perches to the first mentioned place of beginning containing one thousand seven hundred & eighty five acres of land. Returned according to which abovesaid survey & bounds into the Proprietary's Secretary's office this 29th day of the 2^d month 1700. P. Edw^e Penington, Surv' Ge*n*^l
