These are therefore in ye Proprietarys name to will and require thee forthwith to survey or cause to be surveyed unto him ye said quantity of acres in ye aforesaid place where not already taken up. by seating and improving ye same according to Regulation or within six months after ye date of survey and make return thereoff to ye Secretarys Office. dat at Philadel. the 7th day of ye 4th mo. 1690.
