

Pensilvania 55.

By the Commissioners of Property

Whereas Israel Taylor & Joseph Taylor Sons of Christopher Taylor Original Purchaser of five Thousand acres of land in this Province, having formerly obtained two warrants for laying out the remainder of the said purchase, one of them for three hundred acres dated ye 6th day of fifth month 1692 the other for four hundred & fifty eight acres dated the 26 day of October 1709, neither of which said warrants having ^(obi) been executed nor the land mentioned in them yet located. They the said Israel & Joseph now desire that they may resign both the said warrants and that in lieu thereof we would grant them to take up the quantity of acres mentioned in the said warrants being together 758 acres with the ye addition of two hundred & forty two acres which in the whole make one thousand acres, for the last mentioned parcel of 242 acres they agree to pay to the Proprietors use ten pounds for each hundred & in proportion for the rest and the yearly quitrent of one shilling sterling for every hundred acres of the whole. These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be surveyed unto the said Israel Taylor & Joseph Taylor according to the Method of Townships appointed the said quantity of one thousand acres of land within this Province which has not been already surveyed nor appropriated nor is seated by the Indians and make a return thereof into the Secretary's office which survey in case the said Israel & Joseph fulfill the above agreement for the said two hundred and forty two acres within three months after location shall be valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this warrant ever granted Given under our hands & seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 7th day of the 4th month Anno Domini 1716.
