 (Seal) request to us under his hand, assured, that notwithstanding he is none of  
 ye first purchasers ~~yet notwithstanding~~. The Proprietary did promise  
 to Benj ffurly in behalfe of ye said Jacob Telner that he should  
 have within ye Libertys of Philadelphia sixty acres of land, as by  
 advice which he rec<sup>d</sup> f. Lett<sup>r</sup> ffrom ye said Benj ffurly doth  
 express.

These are therefore in ye Proprietarys name to will and require thee ffurtherwith  
 to survey and lay out sixty acres of land in ye Liberties aforesaid as near  
 German-Towne as conveniently may be in ord<sup>r</sup> to preserve ye same till  
 ye Proprietarys Pleasure be knowne herein. Dated at Philad ye 13<sup>th</sup> of ye 2<sup>d</sup>  
 mo. 1688
