


By virtue of a warrant from the Commissioners of Property bearing date  
ye 1<sup>st</sup> of 2<sup>n</sup> 1702. to survey unto Robert Ashton Gent five hundred acres of land  
near the White-Marsh in the County of Philadelphia. In pursuance of a  
grant made to him (as he affirmeth) by the Proprietary. There was sur-  
veyd. and laid out to the said Robert Ashton the 20<sup>th</sup> day of the same month  
and year ~~the said yeare fifteen hundred acres~~ <sup>a tract</sup> of land in the place a-  
foresd Beginning at a black oak at a corner of Edward Farmers land  
extending thence by the line of the said Farmers land north west three  
hundred and forty Pches to an oak Sapling Thence by the line of ~~the~~  
<sup>Micah</sup> ~~Thomas~~ his land northeast one hundred forty eight perches to  
an Oak Sapling Thence southeast by the land Edward Hopton, Jo. Knight  
and Daniel Quare three hundred & forty perches to a post Thence by  
the said Edward Farmers land southwest one hundred and forty  
eight Pches to the place of the beginning containing three hundred  
and fourteen acres Surveyd by Tho. Fairman.  
Certified in the General Surveyors office by Jacob Taylor.

conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of
