At the request of Robt Assheton, That I would grant him to take up
seven Hundred and fifty acres of land being his proportion of ~~one~~
three thousand acres granted to his father William Assheton and
children. These are to require thee forthwith to survey or cause to
be surveyed unto him, ^{at & in two several times and places.} the said number of seven hundred and
fifty acres of land in this Province not already taken up, nor
surveyed nor concealed, to be laid out according to the method
of Townships by me appointed and make returns thereof into
my Secretaries office. Given under my hand and seal at Philad^{ia}
the 9th day of 10th 1700.
