William Penn Absolute Proprietary & Governor⁶⁶¹ in chief
of the Province of Pensilvania & Counties Annexed.

At the request of Mary and Alice Hirid Administratrices on the
estate of John Atkinson joint Purchaser with his Brother Christ-
oph^E Atkinson of fifteen hundred acres, That I would grant them to
take up five hundred acre(s) of land in right of the sd John Atkin-
sonis children. These are to require thee forthwith to survey or cause
to be surveyed to the use of the said childr(s) the aforesaid num-
ber of acres (being their full share of ye sd Purchase) of land not al-
ready taken up nor surveyed nor concealed. They taking out a Patent
for the same within three months after thou shalt make returns
thereof into my Secretaries office, wch thou art hereby required to do
with all convenient(s) speed. Given under my hand and seal of Phila-
delphia the 18th day of Febr. 1700.
