

Surveyd and laid out the 26th of the 2^d mo- 83 by virtue of a warrant from the Governor dated the 19th of the 2^d month 1683 unto William Smith 500 acres of land in the County of _____ beginning at a corner marked stump of a tree standing one hundred foot to the southward of a small Run of water from thence S 75^o W by the land of William Powel 32 perches to a corner marked Red oak standing on the north west side of the aforesaid R(obl) from thence west by the said Powels land 32 perches to a corner marked white oak from thence N 2^o northerly by the aforesaid Powels land 700 perches to a corner marked Oak sappling from thence N by a line of marked trees 100 perches to a corner maple tree from thence east by the land of Richard Marsh 300 perches to a corner marked post standing on the west side of a small Run from thence S down the said run 17 perches to a corner marked Chestnut tree being a corner tree of the land belonging to Will^m Warner from thence E by the said Warner's land 350 perches to a corner marked black oak standing on the south side of a small Creek by the Schuykill River from thence down the several courses of the river to the first mentioned Stump containing & laid out for 500 acres returned according to which abovesaid survey and bounds into the Proprietary's Secretary's office the 13th of the 9th month 1684.
