

By virtue of a warrant from the Proprietaries dated the Two(obl)ieith day of November 1734 and a special order from the Surveyor General dated the third day of December ffollowing there was surveyd to Benjamin Fairman & Peter Rambo two tracts of lands the one situate on the west side the river Schuylkill in the County of Lancaster. Beginning at a Beech tree standing on the bank of the said River Schuylkill thence by a stream of water part of the said river and which forms an Island in the same containing about eighty acres south sixty three degrees west twenty one perches to a Black oak thence by vacant land north west one hundred and twenty two perches to a Black oak thence by vacant land south west one hundred and seventy two perches to a white oak sapling thence by vacant land south east four hundred perches to a corner stone thence by vacant land north east one hundred and six perches to a Birch tree on ye bank of the sd river thence by ye same crossing the stream aforesd north north west one hundred & five perches thence north twelve degrees west one hundred perches thence north west forty six perches thence north eighteen degrees west twenty two perches to ye sd stream thence crossing the same four perches to the place of Beginning Containing three hundred & fifty acres with the usual allowance of six p. cent. Including ye Island aforesd. The other tract of land situate on the east side of Schuylkill opposite to the former Beginning at a Black oak standing on the bank of the said river thence north seventy degrees east forty seven perches to a post thence by vacant land north twenty degrees west one hundred and sixty three perches to a red oak thence by vacant land south seventy degrees west fifty six perches to a post near a markt Black oak standing on the bank of sd River thence down the several courses of the same to the place of Beginning Containing fifty acres with the usual allowance of six p. cent. Surveyd December 9<sup>th</sup> 1734 Returned into the Secretary's office the 23<sup>rd</sup> day of January Anno Dom 1734 according to the (ob)above description sd(s)e Entry page 32(obl.) by Nich<sup>e</sup> Scull.
