 By a General resurvey of the Township of Cheltenham, made the 28<sup>th</sup> day  
 of the 2<sup>d</sup> month 1703. There was resurveyed unto John Ashmead a tract of  
 land in the said Township to in right of his father John Ashmeads pur-  
 chase of two hundred and fifty acres. Beginning at a white oak sappling at a  
 corner of Everd Boltin<sup>s</sup> land and extending thence by the said Boltins line south  
 west five hundred and twenty-six perches to a post at <sup>another</sup> a corner of said Boltins  
 land. Thence north west eighty-two perches to a post at Toby Leech his corner.  
 Then by <sup>a</sup> the said Leech his line north east five hundred and twenty-six  
 perches to a post. Thence south east eighty-two perches to the Beginning  
 containing two hundred and sixty-nine acres.
