thence north east by east three hundred and forty perches to a Maple
tree by the said Perqueorinck Creek thence up the said Creek on sev-
eral Courses four hundred & sixty perches to a post thence south
west five hundred and forty perches to a Hickry tree by Schuykil Then
down the said River on several Courses three hundred and ten perches
to the Beginning.
