By the Commissioners of Property.

At the Request of Ralph Assheton of the City of Philadelphia That we would grant him to take up and inclose one square of Ground between Sassafras Street & Vine Street and between the sixth & seventh streets from Delaware and that he may hold ye same for the Termne of one & Twenty years next ensuing the date hereof, for which he agrees to pay to the use of the Prop^r or Trustees of the Province ffifty Shillings Mory of the same yearly during the said Term and at the expiration thereof to deliver up and surrender the saidie under a good fence and well improved. These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be surveyed unto the said Ralph Assheton in ye place aforesaid the said square of Ground To be by him held under the said yearly Rent of ffifty shillings Mory aforesaid, which in case the said Ralph do & shall yearly pay Then this survey for the said Term shall be valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this warrant ever granted Given under our hands & the lesser seal of the Province at Philadelphia the first day of the first month Anno Domⁱ 1720/21.
