

These are to authorize and require thee to survey and lay out to the said Robert Assheton in the right aforesaid according to the Method of Townships appointed, the said quantity of five hundred acres of land in this Province that has not been already survey'd nor taken up nor is conceal'd nor seated by the Indians And make returns into the General Surveyor's Office at Philadelphia where this Warrt is to remain and a copy thereof to be delv'd to thee certified by the Secretary Given under our hands and the seal of the Province at Philad^{ia} the 3^d day of the 11th Moth 170^{3/4}.
