At the request of Elizabeth Vickris by her agent Benjamin Davies That I would grant her to take up five hundred acres of land in right and as part of her late husbands purchase of two thousand acres. These are to require three forthth to survey or cause to be survey'd to the sd Elizabeth Vickris according to the method of townships by me appointed the sd number of five hundred acres of land in this Province that has not been already survey'd nor taken up nor that is concealed nor sealed by the Indians And make returns thereof into my Secretaries office. W^{ch} survey being duly made & returned ~~about~~ if seated within twelve months after date thereof Shall be confirmed to her her heirs & assigns for ever. Given under my hand and seal. at Philad^{ia} the 3^d of the 2^d moth 1701.
