



By virtue of a warrant from the Commission<sup>es</sup> bearing date the 16 day of the twelveth month 1701/2 to survey and lay out unto Benjamin Furley the complement of his land untaken up & resurvey the former I certify into the Surveyor<sup>es</sup> Gen<sup>le</sup>s office that I have surveyed and laid out to him his complement of land being one thousand nine hundred acres in the County of \_\_\_\_\_ Beginning on Schuylkill at a white oake marked for a corner being the bounds of the Frankford Corrip<sup>es</sup> land thence northeast by the same nine hundred and fifty perches to a corner marked Spanish oake thence southeast by Va: land three hundred and twenty perches to a post near a greate Rock stone thence south west by land of the London Corrip<sup>es</sup> nine hundred ~~seventy~~<sup>eighty</sup> six perches (ob.) a Spanish oake marked for a corner standing by the Schuylkill thence up by the severall courses thereof unto the place of begining.
