By virtue of the Proprietaries Commission's warrant to me directed to resurvey all the lands laid out and reputed to be Benj^a Furley's By directions of a returne made by Charles Astcom within the County of Chester betwixt the branches of Chester Creek and the Branches of Brandywine Creeke I have resurveyd the same according to the old lines viz Beginning at a red oake marked for a corner Thence north north west by the land of John Beasor 640 perches to a post set in the ground wth a parcell of stones about it. Thence west south west south west by va: land 262 perches to a Gum tree marked for a corner standing by a branch of Brandywine Creek Thence south south east by va: land 640 perches to a post neare unto a Chestnut marked for a corner Thence east north east by the lands of Rich Whitpane and Compt^a 262 perches to the first mentiond red oake Containing one thousand and forty eight acres of land laied out 25th of the 4th moth 1703 Presuuant to the said warrant dated the ____ day of the ____ moth 170____
