

These therefore are to will and require thee forthwith to resurvey ~~the said~~ or cause to be resurveyed the sd Tract according to the true bounds and first Lines thereof.

Also to make an equal Partition of the sd Tract between the sd Walter & Edward-leaving unto each such Improvem^t & Conveniences as they now stand possess'd of and make Returns of thy Resurvey into my Secretaries Office. Given under my hand & Seal at Philadelphia the 22^d of the 6^{mo} 1701
