

 rate of fifteen pounds for every hundred acres and one bushel of wheat Quitrent annually  
 forever after. These are to Require thee to Survey and lay out to the said Isaac ffew the  
 sd Tract of six hundred Acres of Land Scituate as aforesaid provided that no other per-  
 son make a just claim thereunto and make Returns into the General <sup>Surveyor's</sup> ~~Secretary's~~ Office  
 at Philad<sup>ia</sup> where this Warrt is to remain & a Copy thereof to be delvd. to thee cer-  
 tified by the Secretary: Which ~~Warrt~~ ~~Resu~~ Survey in case the sd Isaac fulfill the Agreement  
 aforesd within four months after the date hereof with lawfull Interest for three months,  
 shall be valid otherwise shall be void & of no effect otherwise than as if the same had never
