



Resurveyed on the 28th day of June 1735 a Tract of Land belonging to the Honourable the Proprietaries. situate in the Township of Amity in the County of Philad^a. Beginning at a post on the East bank of Schulkill River. Thence by a Tract of land laid out to Mounce Justice N 18 E 1396 perches to a post. thence 568 E. by land of Benj^d Longworthy 39 and by Vacant Land 61 perches to a post. thence by the Lands of David Harry & William Davis 520° W 1325 pches to a White Oak on the Bank of 5d River, thence up the several Courses of the same to the place of Beginning. Containing 600 Acres with the Usual Allowance of Six $\frac{1}{2}$ Cent.

If these two persons and another who offers to take the part next the River will give 50⁰ ays^d & new Rent they may have the 400 Acres. if not they must remove immediately.
