A warrant dat 13th March 1743 to accept the following survey for Peter Longacre.

In pursuance of a warrant from the Proprietaries dated the 21st day of July A^o D^r 1736 there was resurveyed and divided unto Peter Longacre and Andrew Longacre sons of Andrew Peterson Longacre on the 26th day of August then next ensuing a tract of land situate in Siamensing (now called Kingsess township) in the County of Philadelphia to them belonging a part thereof belonging to the said Peter Beginning at a post by the side of a run of Water being a corner of other part of the said tract belonging to the said Peter and from thence extending by the same the three courses and distances next following Vizt. North sixty nine degrees west one hundred and eighty eight perches to a post by the Great Road leading to Philadelphia. Thence along the same road north fifty two degrees east Forty six perches to a post in a line of land formerly belonging to Peter Yocum. Thence by the same south sixty nine degrees east Two hundred and fifty three perches to a post by the said Run of Water which run divides this from land of Joseph Boyce. Thence down the same run on the several courses thereof to the place of Beginning containing sixty six acres. Returned into the Secretary's office the 1st day of ~~September~~ March Anno Domini 1743.
