

By vertue of a warr from Edward Pennington Surveyor General bearing  
date ye 4<sup>th</sup> of ye 8<sup>th</sup> mo. 1700. directed unto me I do hereby certifie into  
his office that I have surveyed and laid out unto the proprietor and  
Governors proper use and behoof the 8th of (obl.) in ensuing a certaine  
tract of land in the township(obl.) Limbrak in the county of Philadelphia begining  
at a (obl.) by a street or roade runing through the  
said township from (obl.) by a line of marked trees deviding it from  
Joseph Riks land(obl.) south west five hundred perches to a post sett in the  
ground fr(obl.) there north west by a line of marked trees one hundred  
and sixty perches to another post sett in the ground from thence northerly  
east by a line of marked trees five hundred perches to a post by the  
said street or roade and by the same south east b(obl.) line of mark  
ed trees one hundred and sixty perches to the p(obl) of begining  
Containeing and laid out for five hundred acres(obl) land.
