Whereas Thomas Latta of the County of York hath requested that we would
allow — ~~take up~~ grant him our warrant for two hundred acres of land adjoining
 lands of John McGaughy Henry Cotton Elizabeth Wilson James Wilson & David
 McClellan in Hamiltonbar Township being part of the 30,000 acres which by
 our warrant of the eighteenth day of June 1741 we directed our then Surveyor
 General to survey on the Branches of Marsh Creek on the west side of the River
Susquehanna then in the County of Lancaster now York for our own proper use
 and the same to return under the Name & style of our Manor of Maske And
 it appearing to us that the said two hundred & fifty acres of land were settled
 before the issuing our said Warrant for the said Manor. We have notwithstanding
 condescended & agreed to grant the same to the said Thomas Latta
 on the then common Terms, the Intrest & Quitrent to commence from
 the first day of March in the year 1740. being the time of the Settlement
 thereof ~~in the County of~~ — And for which he agrees to pay to our use
 within the Term of six months from the Date hereof at the rate of
 Fifteen Pounds Ten shillings, current money of this Province for every
 Hundred acres; and also to pay the yearly Quitrent of one Halfpenny
 Sterling for every acre thereof, to us our Heirs and Assigns forever.
 These are therefore to authorise and require you to survey, or cause
 to be surveyed unto the said Thomas Latta at the Place aforesaid,
 according to the Method of Townships appointed, the said Quantity of
 Two hundred acres ~~one~~, ~~if not already surveyed or appurtenant~~ and make
 return thereof into the Secretary's Office, in order for Confirmation; for
 which this shall be your sufficient warrant: Which warrant and sur-
 vey, in case the said Thomas Latta fulfil the above Agreement within
 six Months from the Date hereof, shall be valid, otherwise void. Given
 under my Hand, and the seal of the Land-Office, by virtue of certain
 Powers from the said Proprietaries, at Philadelphia, this sixteenth
 day of April Anno Domini One Thousand seven hundred and sixty
