Whereas Jennett Gilmore of the county of York, hath requested that we would grant
~~her~~ our warrant for two hundred acres of land, adjoining David Porter Mascs
 McCarley Robert Johnston & John Armstrong ~~is~~ including the improvement she
 bought of W^m McCarley in Cumberland Township, York County, being part of the
 Thirty Thousand acres of land which by our warrant of the eighteenth day
 of June, One Thousand seven hundred and Forty-one, we directed our then
 Surveyor General to survey on the Branches of Marsh-Creek, on the West
 side of the River Susquehanna, then in the County of Lancaster, now York, for
 our own proper use, and the same to return under the Name and style of
 our Manor of Maske; and it now appearing to us, that the said two hun-
 dred acres of land was settled before the issuing our said warrant
 for the said Manor, we have notwithstanding condescended and
 agreed to grant the same to the said Jennett Gilmore on the then
 common Terms, the Interest and Quitrent to commence from the First
 day of March, One Thousand seven Hundred and thirty nine being the
 Time of settlement, and for which he agrees to pay to our Use, with-
 in the Term of six Months from the date hereof, at the rate of Fifteen
 Pounds Ten shillings, current Money of this Province, for every hundred
 acres; and also to pay the yearly Quitrent of One Halfpenny Sterling for
 every acre thereof, to us, our heirs and assigns forever: These are there-
 fore to authorise and require you to survey, or cause to be surveyed unto
 the said Jennett Gilmore at the place aforesaid, according to the Method
 of Townships appointed, the said Quantity of Two hundred acres, and
 make return thereof into the Secretary's Office, in order for Confirma-
 tion; for which this shall be your sufficient warrant: Which warrant
 and survey, in case the said Jennett Gilmore fulfil the above Agreement
 within six Months from the date hereof, shall be valid, otherwise void.
 Given under my hand, and the seal of the Land-Office, by virtue of certain
 Powers from the said Proprietaries, at Philadelphia, this twenty seventh
 day of August Anno Domini One Thousand seven hundred and sixty five.
