Whereas Charles Vance of the County of York hath requested that we would
~~not~~ grant him our warrant for three hundred acres of land joining the
 Maryland line and the lands of Dunken Evans Benjamin McCormick John Paxton
 & Samuel Paxton in Cumberland township being part of the Thirty thousand
 acres which by our warrant of the eighteenth day of June 1741, We directed
 our then Surveyor General to survey on the Branches of Marsh Creek on the
 West side of the River Susquehanna, then in the County of Lancaster now York,
 for our own proper use and the same to return under the Name & style of
 our Manor of Maske; And it appearing to us, that the said three hundred
 acres was settled before the issuing our said warrant for the said Manor, we
 notwithstanding have condescended & agreed to grant the same to the said
 Charles Vance on the then Common Terms the Interest & Quitrent comm-
 mencing from the first day of March 1741 being the Time of settlem't
 thereof. ~~the~~ — And for which he agrees to pay to our use, within the
 Term of six Months from the date hereof, at the rate of Fifteen Pounds Ten
 shillings, current Money of this Province, for every Hundred acres; and also
 to pay the yearly Quitrent of One Halfpenny Sterling for every acre thereof,
 to us, our Heirs and Assigns forever: These are therefore to authorise
 and require you to survey, or cause to be surveyed unto the said Charles Vance
 at the Place aforesaid, according to the Method of Townships appointed,
 the said Quantity of three hundred acres, if not already surveyed or appro-
 priated, and make return thereof into the Secretary's office, in order for Con-
 firmation; for which this shall be your sufficient Warrant: Which warrant
 and survey, in case the said Charles Vance fulfil the above Agreement with-
 in six months from the date hereof, shall be valid, otherwise void. Given
 under my hand, and the seal of the Land- Office, by virtue of certain
 Powers from the said Proprietaries, at Philadelphia, this sixteenth day of
 April Anno Domini One Thousand seven Hundred and sixty five.
