

In pursuance of the above Warrant There was surveyd and laid out for the
sd Clement Plumsted on the fifth day of December Anno 1720 a certain Part
of the said Swamp or Cripple Beginning at a post ^{at} a corner of James
steels land Thence by the said Road South about seventeen degrees east forty
perches to a post ^{at} a corner of George Fitz waters Land Then by the same
south seventy degrees West eighteen perches crossing Little Hollanders
Creek to a post on the West side of the said Creek Then by the said
Creek on the West side thereof about fifty seven perches to a post at
a corner of the said James Steels Land Then by the same North
sixty three degrees East crossing the said Creek thirty perches to
the Place of Beginning containing six acres and one half acre. Also one
other Piece or Parcel of the said Swamp or Cripple Beginning
at a Post by the said Road at a corner of the said George
Fitzwater's Land Thence by the said Road South about seventeen degrees
east ~~twenty perches~~ ~~six~~ perches to a post at a corner of the said
James Steels land Then by the same West twenty six perches to
a post Then by the said Clement Plumsted's other land North
about five degrees east thirty five perches to the Corner of the
said George Fitzwater's Land Then by the same East ^{five perches} ~~to a~~
Swamp Oak on the West Side of the said Little Hollanders
Then south east Creek ^{eighteen} crossing the said Creek ~~on the same course with~~
~~fifteen~~ perches to the place of Beginning containing six acres.
