By the Commissioners of Property or Agents to the Trustees
 In Pursuance of an agreement made by us about five years since with
 divers persons of this city Philad^a for ye better Improvement of Several quan-
 tities of that vacant Swamp or Cripple which lyes between the Lands of Moy-
 amensing Wickaco & Delaware River These are to authorize and require
 thee to survey unto Clement Plumsted, George Fitzwater & James Steel
 all of the said City That part of the said Swamp or Cripple which lies be-
 tween the Road as now designed to be laid out through the same to ye
 Point on Delaware opposite to Gloucester in West Jersey to ye Eastward
 and other meadow & Swamp of the said Clement and George to ye
 westward, and between the line of Wickaco Swamp & Cripple to ye
 Northward and ye south line of said Clement & George extended to the
 southward containing about eighteen acres. To hold to the said Clement
 Plumsted George Fitzwater & James Steel their Heirs & Assignes for
 ever upon their paying to ye Trustees of this Province Twenty Shillings
 Money of the same for every Acre thereof and after the Rate of One shill-
 ing Sterling for one Hundred acres for a yearly quitrent forever Upon this
 further Condition nevertheless that ye said Clement Plumsted George
 Fitzwater & James Steel their Heirs & assignes shall within the space
 of Seven years next ensuing after ye date hereof well and sufficiently
 Bank & Drein ye said parcel of Swamp & Cripple intended to be here-
 by granted so as to make the same fit for Pasture or mowing. Given
 under our Hands & the lesser Seal of ye Province at Philadelphia
 the 20th day of the 12th month Anno Din. 1719/20.
