One Hundred acres in right of Jeremiah Osborn and his wife Servants to Griffith Jones fifty acres in right of Jacob Willis Serv<sup>t</sup> to W<sup>m</sup> Cloud fifty acres in right of Evan Williams Servant to Thomas Ellis and y<sup>e</sup> same quantity in right of his Wife Elizabeth Servant to John Bevan being in y<sup>e</sup> whole three hundred acres at a Halfpenny Sterling Poore These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey and Lay out to y<sup>e</sup> said Phillip Howell according to y<sup>e</sup> Method of Townships appointed y<sup>e</sup> said quantity of three hundred acres of Land in this Province not already Survey'd nor taken up nor is Conceal'd nor Seated by y<sup>e</sup> Indians and make returns into y<sup>e</sup> General Surveyor's Office at Philad<sup>lp</sup> where this Warrant is to remain and a Copy thereof to be Deliv<sup>d</sup> to thee certified by y<sup>e</sup> Secretary Given under our Hands and y<sup>e</sup> Seal of y<sup>e</sup> Province at Philad<sup>lp</sup> 22-9 br 1703.
