Whereas by Deeds of Lease and Release dated the 22^d & 23^d days of May Ann Dom 1724 Our Late Mother Hannah Pettit since deceased Execut^{rs} of the Last Will & Testament of Our Father William Pettit Esq^r Proprietor and Governour in Chief of Our said Province also Deceased & We John Pettit & Thomas Pettit did Grant to James Logan of the said Province then in the City of London Merch^t [together with other Land^s] the Quantity of Two Thousand Acres within Our Province Whereof a Tract Supposed to Contain One thousand five Hundred Acres had been ^{before} Surveyd on Shickasawunga Creek A branch Running in^{to} Susquehanna River and the Remaining five Hundred Acres were to be laid out where the Same might be found Vacant But afterwards upon Examining the Survey of the first mentioned Tract the Same was found to Contain no More than One thousand four hundred Acres And the Usual Allowance of Six P^{er} Cent for Roads and Highways Whereupon the s^d James Logan to Complete the Quant^y of the s^d Two thousand Acres Obtained a Survey on Six hundred Acres Lying on the East Side of the said River now in y^e County of Lancaster which he Caused to be divided by an East or West Line into Two Lots or parcels of Three Hundred Acres Each, The Southernmost of w^{ch} Said Lots or parcels he sometime Since Sold & conveyd to Samuel Blunston [And with whom he hath now Bargained for the other Three hundred Acres] Now He the said James Logan Requesting our Warrant to Establish & Confirm y^e Survey of the whole Six Hundred Acres of Land, These are therefore to Authorize & Require thee to Accept and Receive into thy Office the Survey of the said Six Hundred Acres of Land As the Same was first Surveyed & laid out And make Return thereof into the Secretarys Office for which this shall by thy Sufficient Warrant Given under thy Hand and the Lesser Seal of Our Province at Philadelphia the 31st day of December Anno Dom 1733.
