Whereas James Logan of Stenton Esq<sup>r</sup> having purchased the Quantity of Two Thousand Acres of Land first Granted to William Lloyd and Abraham Lloyd Deceased, hath since Sold five hundred Acres part thereof to Christopher Stump and others for which a Survey was obtained at Tulpehocken in the County of Lancaster but not duly Returned Therefore these are to Authorize and Require thee to accept the said Survey and make Return thereof with the Several Divisions of the same into Our Secretarys Office in order for Confirmations to be made to the persons who are now Vested with the Right thereof and for so doing this shall be thy Sufficient Warrant Given under my Hand and the Lesser Seal of Our Province at Philad<sup>a</sup>
