

The widow Rudman her overplus land (being a small piece lying between the bounds of her land according to Peter Dalbo's old Patent, and the River Schuylkill) begins at a small sappling by the said River at a corner ^{of} Charles Sober's Land thence down the said River on the Water Courses of the same about sixty-five perches Then by a piece of vacant land south east twenty-six perches to a post thence by the said Rudman's Land north eighty-one degrees east ten perches. Then north east forty perches to the place of beginning containing four acres and three quarters of an acre.
